The response to this initial outreach effort was tremendous. Thank you to all of our partners for helping to spread the word. The comment period was open from Aug. 26 through Oct. 7, 2013 with multiple ways to offer input.

- **Survey Highlights**

We asked you to prioritize the transportation strategies that are most important to you regarding safety, mobility, and preservation and renewal and to use the interactive map to pinpoint any transportation needs that concern you. Over 2,000 people from all over the state completed the survey and mapped over 7,000 points! You can view a preliminary report of survey data on page 2.

- **Webcast Public Meeting**

STC Chairman and PA Department of Transportation Secretary, Barry J. Schoch facilitated an interactive online public meeting on Sept. 26, 2013. Over 100 people participated and heard about the STC, the recently released Transportation Performance Report, the Twelve Year Program and had questions answered. - **Project Feedback Forms**

We received over 120 Project Feedback Forms relating to specific suggestions for projects around Pennsylvania. The majority of the project needs that were submitted are related to bridges. Other project suggestions include pedestrian, bicycle, highway and transit projects.

- Over 4,000 people visited the website in the first month

- 48 people submitted 123 project forms
- Over 100 people attended the webcast public meeting


